Criteria for Completion

- Students must maintain an overall average of at least 70% in the program.
- Students must maintain an average of at least 80% in any given subject area to complete the program (i.e.listening section).
- If students fail to attend 80% of the classes (more than 4 absences), they will not pass the course.

Qualification for Application

- Regular course, courses for beauty arts majors, immersion course: Students who have graduated from a high school (or equivalent) or attained a higher education certificate are eligible to apply.
- Special Track: Application requirements are subject to change

Note

- * The application can be downloaded from the school website. The application can be submitted either by mail or e-mail(lcec@skuniv.ac.kr). Once the registration is completed, we will notify the students with further instructions on the payment. (Please check the attachment below). (mail address: Language and Culture Education Center, Seokyeong University, Seokyeong-ro, 124, Sungbuk-gu, Seoul, 02713, Korea)
- * Scan the required documents with the application form and submit by e-mail.
- * Students from China or other countries outside of the visa waiver program will need to provide original documents (not scans) and submit them by mail.
- * Studentswill be notified of admission2-3 weeks after Seokyeong has received their documents.
- * If accepted, Seokyeong will send a letter of acceptance to potential students. After receiving this letter, students should visit the Korean Embassy to apply for a visa. The visa application process at Korean Embassies typically takes about 1 week.

Tuition Payment

- Instructions on how to pay tuition will be given to students after they have been accepted.
- Tuition must be paid to the school bank account.[Details on the website.]
- Tuition must be remitted in the name of the applicant.

Refund

- By one month before the start of the course students can get a full refund(except admission fee).
- By one month before the start of the course students can receive refund 90% of tuition.
- By one week after the start of the course students can receive refund 70% of tuition.
- By two weeks after the start of the course student can receive refund 50% of tuition.
- Refunds will not thereafter week after course start.

An apostille or a consular certificate

4. An English original transcript of the final school

5. An original certificate of bank balances under the student's name

If the certificate of bank balance is under a parent's name, the family relation certificate must also be submitted.

6. Family relation certificate

Nationals from 21 countries announced by the Minister of Justice should submit a copy of a family relation certificate.

** 21 countries: China, the Philippines, Indonesia, Bangladesh, Vietnam, Mongolia, Thailand, Pakistan, SriLanka, India, Myanmar, Nepal, Iran, Nigeria, Uzbekistan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Ukraine, Ghana, Egypt, Peru

7. Insurance policies

Note

- * In the case of a D-4 visa application requested after January 1, 2016, TB high-risk country nationals must submit an official hospital TB report including chest X-ray results to the Embassy of South Korea in accordance with the Guidelines for visa and residence for foreigners with tuberculosis. To inquire about designated hospitals, please contact the closest Korean Embassy in your country.
- * Countries with a high risk for tuberculosis: Cambodia, Myanmar, the Philippines, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Mongolia, India, Micronesia, India, Nepal, Vietnam, Thailand, Russia, China, Sri Lanka, Uzbekistan, Malaysia, East Timor, Kyrgyzstan
- * Documents submitted in scanned form will not be returned.

Documents for Submission (For Chinese Applicants)

- 1. Application (including 1 photo)
- 2. A copy of passport (or alien registration card)
- 3. A copy of diploma of the final school
- 4. An English original diploma or transcript of the final school
- 5. An English original transcript of the final school
- If there is no certificate in English, students have to submit a notarial translated certificate.
- 6. An original certificate of bank balances under the student's name
- If the certificate of bank balance is under a parent's name, the family relation certificate must also be submitted.
- 7. Family relation certificate
- A student whose parents are divorced or passed away, must submit a notarial certificate that proves the relationship with father or mother.
- 8. Insurance policies

Not

- * 2 educational certificates and 2 certificates of bank balance should be issued under the student's name, if the student is in China and need to apply for the language course visa (D-4) through the school. Original ones should be submitted to Language & Culture Education Center and the rest should be submitted to diplomatic office when you apply for a visa.
- * Documents submitted in scanned form will not be returned.

Insurance for international students

- Every student is required to have insurance. Students who already have an insurance in their home country should submit relevant documentary evidence to the Language & Culture Center.
- All other students must apply for Korean private insurance or national health care.

Placement test

- The placement test will be conducted on one week before classes begin.
- Placement tests focus mainly on writing and speaking.

Benefits

- Students enrolled in the language institute who want to major in Beauty Arts are invited to observe and participate
- Before enrolling in the Beauty Arts program, students are also invited to join a Beauty Arts study group.
